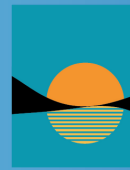

River Bend Hospital is licensed by the Indiana FSSA Division of Mental Health and Addiction and accredited by the Joint Commission as a nonprofit psychiatric hospital.



Acute inpatient mental health treatment is the highest level of psychiatric care. Treatment is provided in a 24-hour, secure and protected, medically staffed environment with an interdisciplinary team approach. Daily evaluations by a psychiatrist, twenty-four-hour skilled psychiatric nursing care, medical evaluation, and a structured atmosphere are required. The goal of the inpatient stay is to stabilize the individual who is experiencing an acute psychiatric condition.

The following criteria are intended as a guide for establishing medical necessity for the requested level of care. The criteria are not a substitute for clinical judgment and should be applied by appropriately trained clinicians considering the unique circumstances of each patient, including co-morbidities, safety, and supportiveness of the patient's environment.

General Admission Criteria for Self- and Non-Medical Referrals (Law enforcement, voluntary self-referral, Non-profit navigators, crisis response center)

When referring someone from a nonmedical facility, our admissions staff will attempt to gather as much information as clinically necessary to determine if a patient meets the eligibility criteria for admission to our level of care. Additional information may be necessary or requested depending on the needs of the individual requiring care.

- Does the patient demonstrate actual or imminent danger to self or others, or is grossly impaired as evidenced by at least ONE of the following (suicidal, homicidal, gravely disabled, etc.)?
- Upon arrival, patient evaluation will include, but not be limited to, assessing the patient's medical history, mental status, symptoms, risk factors, and treatment needs.
- If there is a concern regarding the medical stability of the patient, a referral to a local emergency room will occur.

Medical Referral from Acute Medical Facility

- Labs: CBC with diff, CMP, blood alcohol (must be less than $<.10$ for admission), TSH, UA, and UDS (pending, not necessary to be resultd)
- What is the patient's alcohol and other drug use history?
 - Detox/withdrawal?
 - Prescribed methadone and suboxone?
- Current medical status and relevant medical history to include:
 - Vital signs
 - Preexisting medical conditions
 - COVID-19 symptoms
 - Can the patient ambulate? Use a walking device? Perform own ADLs?
 - Incontinent? Use of catheters?
- Has the patient been agitated, required PRN medications, assaulted others, or been restrained?
- Is this admission voluntary or involuntary?

Exclusions: Use of oxygen (intermittent or continuous), IV fluids/medications, detox only, dementia, intellectual developmental disability diagnosis only, <18 years of age, and trach. Wound care will be assessed on a case-by-case basis.
